To listen or not to listen. That is the question. Or maybe more importantly - how to listen to music. Written by: Michael Vamos

Is not listening to music even an option anymore? Who do you know who does not listen to music, in one form or another. Music is everywhere!

Commercials use music, new jingles or cover versions of famous songs that makes fans cringe. Musical scores for movies. TV series, concerts and of course that old faithful radio blasting your favorite tune. The big companies are paying attention too. iTunes, Amazon, etc, etc, all know that it's a vast market.

The soccer-mum listening to the car radio, The gym rat jamming to trip-hop on their headphones, Mexican music blasting from the local deli, music while you're at the supermarket, even music as you desperately try to reach a live operator for your credit card. How we listen, when and where - varies wildly, but almost everyone is a music lover.

60% of the people that buy vinyl records are under 44 years of ago, and 46% of all the people that buy vinyl records are women. People between 24 and 34 buy as many vinyl records as people over the age of 55. You may think that young people only buy pop records, but no. Joe Harley from Blue Note records told me that a huge percentage of buyers of Blue Note's Tone Poet series' vinyl sales was by people under the age of 44. Lastly, vinyl sales was over a billion dollars in 2021, that's Billion with a B. And that's not even including digital sales, which is still the biggest seller by a huge margin. And these numbers are only for the US.

Martin Pipe Hi-Fi World Considering that almost the whole world's population is a music lover of some sort, then why is our passion, our hobby - high-end audio or being an audiophile - such a small percentage of the population? Since we're all music lovers, we are also all potential buyers of audio gear. Whether it be something as simply as better earphones than the crappy Apple earphones, or it be a full range tower speaker in your home. Why does our passion, our hobby, for high quality audio components seems like such a tiny segment, if everyone is a music lover?

Nowadays, large flatscreens have somehow taken the front seat. But I believe that's only because most people never heard how profoundly a high-end system can impact you emotionally.

Long ago, I was told that Apocalypse Now was the greatest war movie ever. So the first time I saw it was on a 12" black-and-white TV with commercials. I was extremely disappointed to say it mildly. Later, I saw it in the theater and... wow! On a huge screen, without interruptions Marlon muttering: "The horror, the horror" and with the explosions at the end as The Doors play "This Is The End". Yeah, it's the greatest war movie ever! Until someone experiences real high-end audio system for themselves, they don't know what they are missing, so why would they go looking for it?

After watching Apocalypse Now that first time, on that crappy little TV. I knew exactly what the story was about, where it took place and who the characters were. But I didn't really care and the movie did not reach me on an emotional level. Much the same as when you listen to music on a crappy system, boom box or little kitchen speaker, you can hear the lyrics and the basic melody, but not much else. The emotional deep connection to all the wonderful things the musicians have created, is more of less lost, simply because they are missing. Many people believe that most women only listen the lyrics and don't care much about how good it sounds, but I think that is far from the truth. I believe women are more music lovers than audiophiles. They don't really care about the specs or inner designs as long as it sounds great, and they can definitely tell. A dealer once bought our turntable brand to a potential customer who already has a different turntable brand. The dealer set it up, and played and it was a vast improvement over the customers existing turntable. His girlfriend

Studies have shown that quality music, lowers your blood pressure, relieves stress and anxiety, and releases endorphins into your blood stream. who was cooking in the kitchen, burst into the listening room: "Wow, what did you do? It

sounds so much better!".



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more casually than the typical audiophile or music lover, the average listeners would still get huge benefits and pleasure from a better sound system. A now retired hi-fi dealer, catered to successful business women in his area, and had monthly music sessions with them. The women loved what they heard, realized it was a great benefit to be able to come home and listen to something truly beautiful at the end of a long stressful day, as a means of winding down

and getting grounded again. And the dealer also discovered that more often than not, these women shaped the home environment for their families. Apparently quality music from a high-end system, offers more benefits to the mental health and well being of the family, than them sitting starring at the TV or playing video games.

I know a wealthy lawyer, who lives in a great house with his family. His house has the typical built-in speakers that houses of this caliber has. I don't know what made him look for better. but one of his friends is a fellow music lover and exposed him to Larsen speakers (which are designed to be placed against the wall). The lawyer heard them, loved them and bought a complete system, speakers, amps, turntable and phono stage. Now while this was not an extremely high priced system, it was still a real investment and cost close to \$50K. A week after he had it installed he told me - "Had I known that a real high system could bring me this much joy I would have bought one twenty years ago. For me this means not being a new wristwatch this year, no biggie." His wife, who was far from enthusiastic when he bought it, now hosts vinyl Wednesdays for her girlfriends. When he bought the system he had a box of old vinyl records. Five years later, he has more vinvl records than me. And his system, along with his luxury car is one of his most prized and appreciated possessions. Visiting him over the years, he continues to upgrade his system, same brands, but better models, almost double the original price. There's no future in which he would even consider not having a high end system.

I met someone I used to listen to music with, years later. The person was in their twenties and not rich, yet the living room had quite a nice stereo system. floor standing speakers, quality turntable, amplifier and hundreds of vinyl records. The stereo was the focus of

the room, and by far the most expensive thing in the apartment, which by the way, had no TV. And why?

My friend had gotten used to listening to music on my system and couldn't imagine life without that kind of high quality music on a regular basis.

A young girl came to listen to one of our systems, and after hearing one track she uttered with pure glee: "if I had a system sounding this good at home, all I would do is sit and listen to music all day long." Songs she had known all her life, had come to life for her, way beyond what she could ever imagined.

Another friend of mine, has been a music lover and audiophile as long as I've known him. After hearing Roger Waters perform The Wall live, he returned home to recreate the experience. He told me, that while it was not quite at the level of the live performance, mostly because of the lack of decibel, his system was close enough for him to believe the illusion when he closed his eyes and relived his glory days.

Lastly, some inspiration. A certain young man I knew, was having a really, really tough year, multiple serious injuries and diseases kept knocking him down. Tragedy in his immediate family hit him hard as well. If it wasn't one disease or another, it was a new injury or tragedy that pounded him further into the ground. It went so far as him turning his thoughts towards ending his life. One day when he was feeling particularly low, he turned on his nice Hi-Fi and played Bob Marley's So Much Trouble in The World - Bless my eyes this morning//

Jah sun is on the rise once again//
The way earthly things are going//
Anything can happen. We got to
face the day//Oh-wee, come what
may.

The part about having to face the day, and that anything can happen, made him get up and get out and soon after things got a lot better for him. To this day, he credits Marley's song, that positive vibe and the lyrics, for saving his life.

The exhibitors at an audio show work hard to bring in gear and set up their rooms, so you can enjoy various kinds of music. If there's something you want to hear, don't be shy to ask. And to truly experience the many splendors of a room, grab a seat. If you stand in the doorway or the back of the room, you won't be able to hear the soundstage and timing of a great system.

I don't necessarily mean the most expensive components on earth, but a true high-end system that has real dynamics, sounds natural, musical and organic without exaggerating certain parts of the music, but simply reveals what the musicians are playing. Maybe its time to change this and let the rest of the world in on the little secret we all know to be true. Invite your friends, neighbors and family over and host music theme nights, and get everyone hooked on this truly amazing pleasure that high-end audio can bring to people. Music is a universal language and while it might not literally save your life, a high-end system certainly makes the ride way more

magical.

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
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
